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# **About Level Up!**

Level Up! was a series of Ontariowide, multi-day career fair events that brought together the best in skilled trades professionals across industry organizations, post-secondary institutions, businesses, associations and more. This year, we were back and bigger than ever with more events in more locations across the province, with events scheduled from September to November 2023.

### Why?

The Level Up! Career Fairs were designed to offer students a hands-on, engaging experience with the goal of:

- Highlighting the future potential of skilled trade industries
- Helping all youth see themselves in the skilled trades
- Clarifying the pathways into and beyond the skilled trades

#### Who Attended the Fairs?

Our goal was to inspire students grades 7 to 12 to take their first step towards a career in industries that are constantly innovating, on the cutting edge of emerging technologies, and making a critical difference in people's lives. We were looking to connect with a diverse group of young people who are hardworking, hands-on, passionate, and committed to positively impacting society. We know students might not realize a career in the skilled trades is right for them. This was a chance to help students explore the possibilities!

## Discussing the Skilled Trades with Your Students

# Who should consider the skilled trades?

- The skilled trades are an ideal career option for students who are hard-working, hands-on, passionate, and committed to positively impacting society.
- In Ontario, there are more than 140 professions within the skilled trades, each serving an important part of our province's economy and making a tangible difference in people's lives. From STEM to service, there is something for everyone.

#### Why consider the skilled trades?

- Skilled trades professionals are in high demand in Ontario, with well-paid, stable, and flexible career opportunities.
- Skilled trades professionals play a critical role in our society, performing diverse, innovative, and future-facing jobs across numerous sectors that we rely on every day.

#### How to get started in the trades

- Students should make sure their current course load provides them with the foundational skills required to pursue a career within the skilled trades.
- Students and parents are encouraged to speak to a teacher or guidance counsellor about apprenticeship opportunities, as well as to understand pathways, next steps and key resources available to young Ontarians.

## 2023 Level Up! Skilled Trades Fair Run of Show (for reference)

Here's an overview of the overall experience at the 2023 Level Up! Skilled Trades Fairs:

- Arrival: An event team member greeted teachers and students upon arrival.\* The event team member delivered a welcome address. Teachers were encouraged to let the students know departure time, and event team members shared more details about where students should assemble for departure.
- Welcome video: Following the welcome address, students made their way into the venue to watch a short welcome video which shared a quick overview of the skilled trades and what to expect during their visit.
- Interacting with exhibitors: From there, students were able to navigate through the fair and interact with exhibitors across the four skilled trades sectors – motive power, service, construction and industrial.
- **Departure**: At the departure time, event staff helped see students back on to the bus safely.

\*Note: It was recommended that teachers allot 1.5 hours for the fair.
